LANE CLOSURES, ROLLING ROADBLOCK ON WB I-4 AT CENTRAL PARKWAY

MULTIPLE NIGHTS:

The Florida Department of Transportation is temporarily closing at night the two left lanes of westbound and eastbound (not at the same time) Interstate 4 (I-4) between State Road (S.R.) 434 and S.R. 436 for one week beginning Sunday, October 22. The closures will alternate each night beginning with the westbound lanes on Sunday night. The westbound I-4 lane closures are from 8:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. See other side of the handout for information about the eastbound I-4 lanes closures and rolling roadblock.

ONE NIGHT:

Beginning at 12 a.m. on Monday, October 23, rolling roadblocks are scheduled to occur on westbound I-4. The rolling roadblocks may occur any time between 12 a.m. and 5 a.m. to allow for a 30-minute window to facilitate girder placement. Westbound I-4 entrance ramps between County Road 46A and S.R. 434 will be temporarily blocked. As the rolling roadblock passes each interchange, law enforcement officers will reopen its entrance ramp. In total, four westbound I-4 entrance ramps will be temporarily closed during the rolling roadblock operations.

The closures and rolling roadblocks are necessary to safely set steel girders for the reconstructed Central Parkway overpass.

LANE CLOSURES, ROLLING ROADBLOCK ON EB I-4 AT CENTRAL PARKWAY

MULTIPLE NIGHTS:

The Florida Department of Transportation is temporarily closing at night the two left lanes of westbound and eastbound (not at the same time) Interstate 4 (I-4) between State Road (S.R.) 434 and S.R. 436 for one week beginning Sunday, October 22. The closures will alternate each night beginning with the westbound lanes on Sunday night. See other side of the handout for information about the westbound I-4 lane closures and rolling roadblock. The eastbound I-4 lane closures are from 9:30 p.m. to 7 a.m.


ONE NIGHT:

Beginning at 12 a.m. on Tuesday, October 24, rolling roadblocks are scheduled to occur on eastbound I-4. The rolling roadblocks may occur any time between 12 a.m. and 5 a.m. to allow for a 30-minute window to facilitate girder placement. Eastbound I-4 entrance ramps between Colonial Drive (S.R. 50) and S.R. 436 will be temporarily blocked. As the rolling roadblock passes each interchange, law enforcement officers will reopen its entrance ramp. In total, seven eastbound I-4 entrance ramps will be temporarily closed during the rolling roadblock operations.

The closures and rolling roadblocks are necessary to safely set steel girders for the reconstructed Central Parkway overpass.
